Dear Grades 3-8 Parents/Guardians:

One way we measure student progress on academic standards is through the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP). Students across California in grades 3–8 and high school take these assessments each spring. These tests were created specifically to gauge each student's performance in English language arts/literacy (ELA), mathematics, and science.

Because CAASPP tests are given statewide, they provide an opportunity to measure the skills of all students against the same academic standards. Given online, the tests are computer-adaptive, allowing more precise measurement of individual skills. Results help identify gaps in knowledge or skills so your child can get the support needed to be successful in school. It's important to remember that statewide tests cannot take the place of the hands-on learning that is taking place in our school. Class assignments and tests designed by your child's teacher all play a part in gauging student achievement.

This year, your child will take the following tests, depending on his or her grade level:

- → Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments for ELA and mathematics: 3rd-8th Grade
- → The California Science Test (CAST): 5th & 8th Grade

Practice and Training Tests can be found on the CAASPP Web Portal at http://www.caaspp.org/practice-and-training/index.html. Here, parents/guardians can experience the kinds of questions that students will encounter on the tests.

Students in applicable grade levels will participate in the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) except as exempted by law. Each year, a parent/guardian may submit a written request to excuse his or her child from any or all parts of the CAASPP assessments for that school year. If the parent/guardian submits the exemption request after testing begins, any test(s) completed before the request is submitted will be scored, and the results will be included in the student's records and reported to the parent/guardian.

Our school testing schedule will be as follows:

April 30 - May 4: Grades 3 and 4

May 7-11: Grades 5 and 6 May 14-18: Grades 7 and 8
